Introductions


eReading lists are automatically created as soon as anyone has ticked the 'yes' box for the question "Would you like to add this item to a reading list?" and completed the questions asked.

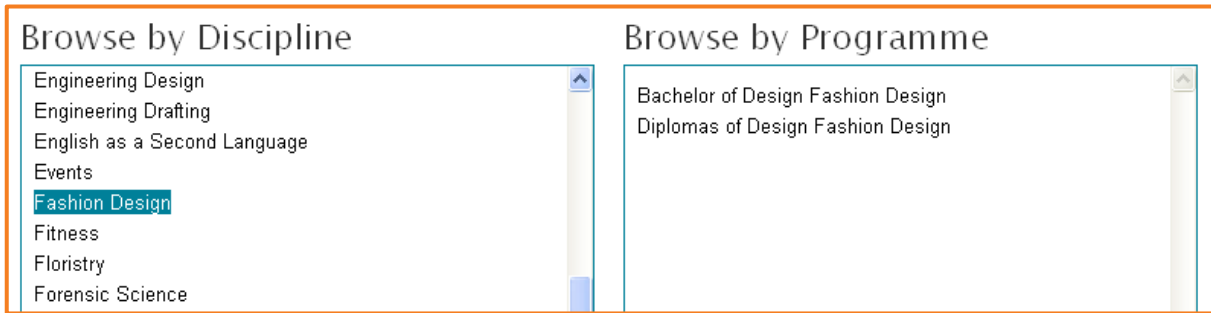
Browsing

Browse the discipline list by clicking on a topic.

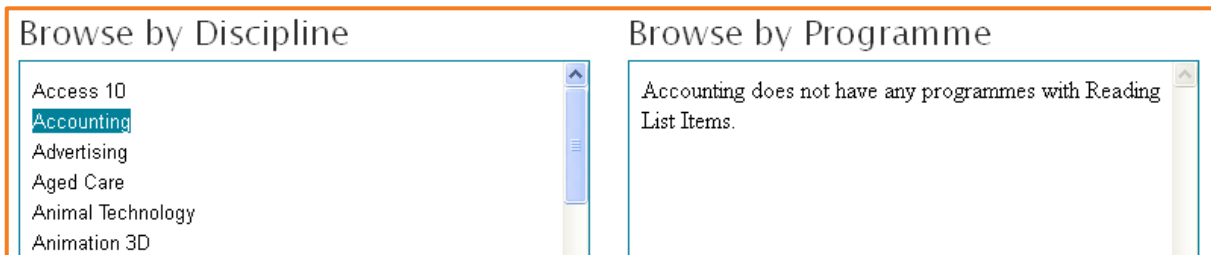

If there are any reading lists created, the list will appear in the Programme panel.

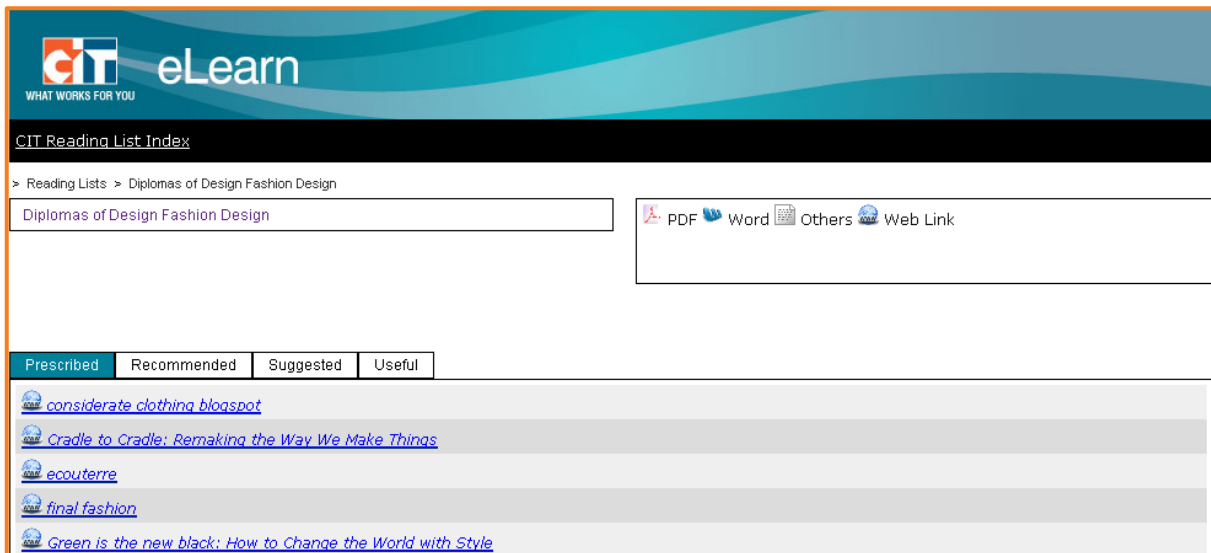


If there are no readings list created, a message will appear in the Programme panel.
