


Voice Presentation

This tool allows you to present web content alongside a voice message. This provides a resource to create a vocal slide show, web tour, or review any student work/assessment – including web pages, images, and internet based media (videos, flash files etc). You can turn Voice Presentation into an asynchronous discussion by allowing students to respond with comments on any slide.

To add a voice presentation

1. Turn editing on.
2. Click on down arrow next to **Add an activity**.
3. Selection **Voice Presentation**.
4. Fill in the form to name your voice presentation.
5. When finish click on **Create and return to course**.
6. Click on the voice presentation that you have created and it will come up with instructions on how to use it. You will need to open the web site or presentation and drag it so you can see it.
7. Follow the instructions, once you have completed your presentation you can edit it.
8. To have a look at what the student will see, go back to the home page and **Switch role to Student**.
9. Click on your voice presentation, when it opens click on the presentation.



Welcome to Voice Presentation

Voice Presentation is a great way to rapidly author an online presentation. It allows instructors to harness the wealth of material on the web, by adding audio and text messages to a selection of URLs.

How do I create a presentation?

1. Click the "New" button to create a new annotated web page, or "slide"
2. Annotate your slide with audio and text
3. Post your slide and continue building your presentation
4. Once your content is created, you can view and edit any slide with the click of a button. You can also reorder your slides via drag and drop.

What else can be done?

1. Turn your Voice Presentation into an asynchronous discussion by allowing students to respond with comments on any slide.
2. Link to multimedia content, like Flash or online videos, and annotate it with your voice.
3. Listen to your entire presentation using "Continuous Playback" (located in the "Options" menu).

The best way to become familiar with this tool is to start using it! Click the "New" button to create your first slide.
